We hope this message finds you well. In case you missed this notice from us yesterday, we are continuing to assess the phishing incident discovered yesterday morning and have found no evidence that any data other than email addresses were accessed. As a reminder, we urge everyone to please be extra cautious and not click any links, attachments or zip files if not 100% certain of the email's authenticity, even if they may appear to be from someone you know, since it may continue the phishing cycle from your own email account. If you do happen to click on a link or download a file from an email and you later question its legitimacy, the FTC provides recommendations on what to do here.

TELPAS Testing Update for Families

The Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS) fulfills federal requirements for assessing the English language proficiency of English learners (ELs) in K-12 in four language domains: listening, speaking, reading, writing. TELPAS evaluates the EL performance and progress on proficiency in the use of academic English on tested domains by using the following levels: beginning, intermediate, advanced, and advanced high. Students in grades K-12 who have been identified as ELs are required to take



TELPAS, including ELs whose parents have declined bilingual or English as a Second Language (ESL) program services. This testing is required to take place in-person at your student's campus.

The testing dates are as follows by date and grade level:

Special Education Survey for Stakeholders

YES Prep is currently participating in the Special Education Differentiated Monitoring and Support Process with the Texas Education Agency. The monitoring process is intended to help YES Prep continuously improve our services to students and to help us reach our vision for students in Special Education. As a stakeholder involved in Special Education, your feedback is critical to our improvement.

Family and Student Survey Results and Highlights

<u>Family Pulse Check Survey Highlights:</u> Thank you for your participation in the recent family and student surveys. Your feedback is invaluable as we continue programming and planning for next quarter. We received over 1300 responses from families and over 10k responses from students. Across the district, there was high satisfaction with our Health and Safety protocols (99% for families, 89% for students) and Communications (95% for families, 90% for students) among both families and students. We also saw a small increase in satisfaction with Engagement among families (up to 89% from 88%) and an exciting increase of 13 percentage points in the area of Community for students since our last administration.

<u>Student Climate Survey Highlights:</u> The YES Prep Student Climate Survey is taken twice a year and measures a student's perception of their school experience. We value student voice and utilize their feedback to drive programmatic decisions and adjustments. Below are the latest survey results we received from students.

Sense of Belonging: 80%

Diversity Equity and Inclusion: 91%

Safety and Behavior: 89%

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Engagement: 80%

• Supportive Relationships: 74%

Academics: 67%Athletics: 73%

Safety and Behavior results are up 14% from this time last year

School/Sense of Belonging results are up 6% from this time last year

We'd like to again thank you for taking the time to submit your feedback to us. Whether students are online or in person, our teachers and staff are working hard to provide a positive experience for students and families.

Family Focused Weekly Workshops

In collaboration with ACE, we are hosting a series of family workshops based on needs that have been identified in focus groups and trends from our pulse check survey. They are hosted virtually on Microsoft Teams each week on Thursdays from 5-6 p.m. If that is not convenient for you, a recording will be shared out in the weekly Family Communication email the following week.

Last week, we hosted an introductory pep rally with the **Step Up** team to learn more about what they have to offer. Step Up programming for Black and Brown high school girls provides access to mentoring relationships which enable them to use their voices and skills to address inequities, reject racism and build coalitions that strengthen their abilities to be future leaders in post-secondary pursuits and careers. Our next family workshops are designed to help you use various **Technology Tools** to support your child's learning. The workshop covers Skyward, Microsoft Teams, and the district website.
